How to set up a private tree on Ancestry

Private and unsearchable trees are recommended for sensitive research, as they're not indexed and can't be searched or seen by other users



1 Create and manage trees
Start the tree by adding one person plus one parent. Uncheck the box 'I am starting with myself'.



2 Give your research tree a name
Uncheck the box so that other people are not allowed to view your tree, and save it.



3 Navigate to tree settings
Make your tree private and unsearchable by ticking the box labelled 'Also prevent your tree from being found in searches'.
